Students form a team,

<u>pick a topic</u> that they want to become experts in,

research the topic,

and then <u>design a web site</u> that uses the Internet to teach that topic.



ThinkQuest Seeks To:



- Establish a library of web sites that are designed for learning
 - ...searchable on-line library of more than 4,000 student-authored educational web sites
- Give students (and teachers) the opportunity to contribute valuable resources to the Internet community ... receiving nearly 3,000,000 hits a day
- Help teachers develop technology skills and to explore techniques in facilitated learning



ThinkQuest Internet Challenge **Judging Criteria**



- 10 Points -- Diversity of Computer & Network Resources among Student Team Members
- 10 Points -- Team collaboration
- 25 Points -- Educational value
- 25 Points -- Entry quality
- 20 Points -- Internet style learning
- 10 Points -- Entry usage

Benefits for Students 1

- Self-confidence: They have completed a large & valuable project successfully
- Respect: They and their skills & talents are being taken seriously
 - An electronic portfolio to knock the socks off college admissions officers
 - Lifelong academic, technical, & teamwork skills



Benefits for students 2

- Learning about Internet and its features useful for learning and for self-paced-education
- Learning of one or more curricular subjects, but also learning how to use IC technology, learning teamwork and English language
- Collaboration with coaches and students in team
- Communication with peers throughout the world
- Awards, events, travel





Best 100 web sites according to number of points awarded by judges

- Students on teams that have created 10 best sites receive \$5,000 each
 - at least one site in each of categories will receive this award
- Students on teams that have created remaining 90 best sites receive \$100 each

- Learning about features of Internet useful in teaching
- Communication with colleagues throughout the world
- Access to ICT training organized by CARNet

Benefits for Schools


- Additional educational activities and Internet based learning activities
