Andrew Cormack joined UKERNA in 1999 as Head of CERT, in charge of the JANET-CERT and EuroCERT services. In 2002 he moved to the new post of Chief Security Adviser, providing advice on security policies and the implications of new developments in network services to customers of the JANET network: universities, colleges and research organisations in the UK. He is a regular speaker at conferences and develops and presents training courses for the JANET community.

Andrew is also active in international collaboration. As a member of TERENA's CSIRT task force he led the development of the CSIRT training course whose presentation and maintenance are now being funded by the European Commission as the TRANSITS project. He has also been a member of the Task Force's projects to develop a common interchange format for incident reports (IODEF), a web site for incident response tools (CHIHT) and is currently working on best current practice documents for the CSIRT community. He chairs the review board of the European Trusted Introducer service.

Before joining UKERNA Andrew worked as a systems administrator at the University of Wales Cardiff, running web and news servers and web caches for the university, and on board the scientific research ships of the Natural Environment Research Council. He has a degree in Mathematics from Cambridge University and is currently studying for pleasure with the Open University. He is a European Chartered Engineer.
