


Initiatives in the FE sector in Wales

Technical support

 - Network monitoring
 - Configuring college JANET router
 - DNS server configuration
 - Advice on network topology
 - Advice on inter-campus connectivity
 - Assistance with patches and security
 - Systems resilience checks
 - Advice on proxying and caching

- Small central team of 5 or 6 people

 - Library/ Learning Resource Centre staff
 - Curriculum staff

- Remit is to "support and promote the use of ILT in teaching and learning"
- 13 autonomous RSCs
 - 9 in England
 - 2 in Scotland
 - 1 in N. Ireland
 - 1 in Wales
- Central Liaison team






